As the COVID-19 toll began its drop, the strict safety measures were progressively lifted allowing the primary healthcare network to start implementing its capacity-building plan based on a participatory needs assessment that targeted the healthcare workers within the PHC centers. Working with the partners, the PHC department to address the identified needs and regain the momentum of its capacity-building efforts. In the first quarter of the year 2022, more than 120 capacity-building sessions were conducted across the country. As the year progresses, the PHC department plans to address the rest of the priority items in an engaging, well-designed approach that matches the needs of the health care workers and contributes to the ongoing support to sustain quality, patient-centered care.

RE-OPENING OF THE CENTRAL DRUG WAREHOUSE


One and a half years after its destruction in the Beirut blast, the Central Drug Warehouse (CDW) has opened its doors again with a new storage capacity that can cater to the needs of one million beneficiaries. The 8000 m3 two-block facility now hosts 12 cold rooms dedicated for short and long-term storage of vaccines and needed medications. To maintain the quality of these vaccines and medications, the warehouse is linked to a real-time temperature monitoring system that allows staff to follow up at all times.

In the coming months, an electronic logistic management system will be launched at the CDW, the system will be linked to the MOPH servers allowing the Primary Healthcare Centers and their inventories to be automatically connected to the CDW and easing all medication transactions.

The vital data observatory at the primary healthcare department aims to monitor maternal and childbirth, and mortality rates. On yearly basis, the VDO issues a yearly report that helps the PHC department make informed decisions on future actions related to the reproductive health and vaccination programs. The reported figures from 2021 show a decrease in the birth rate (8.11 %) in comparison to the previous years (graph 1). Should this trend continue past 2022, it is expected that it will be reflected in decreasing needs for child vaccines in terms of the total quantities per year.
